7.1 General objective of the discipline	<p>The general objective of the course is to familiarize students with sociological theories and their application in film analysis.</p> <p>The students will be able to identify the social and cultural role of film as a means of communication, social and cultural product, as well as to analyze the text/ image relationship within the socio-cultural discourse of the filmic type.</p> <p>The aim is to discuss aspects related to film sociology from the perspective of iconography, social conventions, and ideologies. Students will be able to understand and identify the sociological perspective in film studies and how sociologists can use film as a means of investigating social interactions and the society in which we live.</p> <p>During the meetings, films from different genres, from different geographical and socio-cultural spaces will be analyzed, from the perspective of sociological themes.</p>
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<p>7.2 Specific objective of the discipline</p>	<p>The students will be able to identify the elements of cinematographic sociology and approach the main theories and social phenomena in the analysis of films.</p> <p>They will be able to analyze and use the sociological terminology specific to the cinematographic field in explaining the different forms of expression in the world of film with the help of social theories and social phenomena.</p>

10.5 Seminar/laboratory	Active participation in discussions	Argumentation by appealing to theoretical models, the ability to use theoretical bases and analysis. Ability to understand, reproduce and apply concepts in a coherent and synthetic formula. The students 'seminar activity will be monitored based on their participation in discussions (active involvement in film analysis, reactions to colleagues' interventions, appropriate introduction of concepts and theories presented in the course in film analysis, references to the bibliography).	50%

10.6 Minimum standard of performance

For the course: elaboration of the final project, proving that the student has understood the theoretical concepts presented during the semester, and the ability to use them in the analysis.

For the seminar: presentation and implementation of the theoretical concepts identified in literature, the ability to demonstrate and understand the fundamental concepts presented during the semester through their use in analysis, and intermediary project.

ATTENTION: the exam/minimum performance standard for the course is mandatory to pass this subject, regardless of the score obtained in the Seminar activities.

Academic Dishonesty - plagiarism - in project drawing – is sanctioned. It is considered plagiarism not to quote a source / author of an idea or a piece of published or unpublished text. The penalty for plagiarism is the cancellation of the presented work and the impossibility to promote this course in the first examination session.

Details for online courses:

1. The student must ensure that he/ she has the necessary technology to participate in online activities, the necessary installed applications, video camera, microphone, functional speakers and internet connection. If the student is unable to provide the necessary technology, in whole or in part, he/ she will inform the tutor of the year and will ensure that he/ she fixes this aspect within 7 days from the beginning of the teaching activity.
2. During the online teaching activities, it is recommended that the student keep the video camera open if attendance at that activity (course/ practical course/ seminar / individual practical course) is mandatory, benefiting from the necessary breaks, which will be announced by the professor .
3. In order to demonstrate attendance at activities, the student will have the camera and/ or microphone turned on when the professor makes the attendance list and at any time when he/ she is required to be actively present by the professor (eg. answer to the questions asked) by the professor; team activities indicated by the professor; activities that are part of the evaluation process, etc.). The refusal of the student to comply with this obligation of this regulation will be tantamount to the student's absence from the activity, given that it prevents the verification of his presence and actual participation.
4. The student will keep the microphone closed during the online teaching activities, except when he/ she is directly requested by the professor to intervene verbally or when requesting to speak through the dedicated tools of the application used.
5. The student will not connect to the online teaching activities in spaces unsuitable for their good development (from vehicles, from the street, on the move, etc.). His/ her behavior during the teaching activities must be appropriate to the academic environment, in accordance with Art. 24 (1) of the Student Statute at Babeş-Bolyai University.

Protection of personal data



2. The registration of online activities and exams can be done only if the professor considers it useful for the conduct of the teaching process.


